We are immensely proud of Naman for representing our school with distinction and for making a positive impact beyond academics. Kudos, Naman!




DESIGN AURA 2024: EXPLORING CREATIVITY AND CAREER OPPORTUNITIES




OP JINDAL UNIVERSITY
